#### Point #1

- a) Read John 1:19-23. Compare this passage to Matthew 3:1-6. How does it help with context? (i.e., mood, purpose)
- b) In what way did the Levites and Priests try to fit John the Baptist into their own mold? Be specific.
- c) How does this relate to Point #1 and protecting the Gospel? How do you see this happening today?

#### Point #2

- a) Read John 1:24-28. In what way were the Levites and Priests trying to disqualify John the Baptist? Why?
- b) How did John's response actually avoid the question and redirect? How does this relate to Point #2?
- c) Give an example of how this can happen today when talking to non-Christians. How does Point #2 help you?

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# **Daily Devotions**

## MONDAY // Read John 1:19, Matthew 3:1-6, Mark 1:2-6, Luke 1:1-24, 57-80, 3:1-9

- How does the Gospel of John introduce us to John the Baptist? How do the other Gospels introduce him?
- Why is there such a difference between them? How does it help with context and reveal motives? Be specific.
- How does this encounter help you better understand the dynamics surrounding the Gospel today?

### TUESDAY // Read John 1:19-21, Malachi 4:5, 2 Kings 5:1-8, Deuteronomy 18:15-19, Matthew 17:1-13

- Explain why the Levites and Priests guizzed John the Baptist on "who" he was. (e.g., Elijah, The Prophet)
- How was this related to and not related to the Old Testament? (i.e., wrong identification)
- How did the leaders have a closed mind? How does this help to better understand a closed mind and the Gospel?

# **WEDNESDAY** // Read John 1:19-23, Isaiah 40:1-3, Matthew 10:16-25

- In what way did the Priests and Levites miss the entire message of John the Baptist? Why?
- How did they try to fit him into their mold? How did Jesus prepare his disciples regarding this challenge?
- How can this same thing happen with Jesus and the Gospel today? How does this help prepare you?

### **THURSDAY** // Read John 1:24-25, Matthew 21:23-27

- Why did the Levites and Priests ask John the Baptist about his "authority"? (Hint: who baptized at the time?)
- What were they ultimately trying to do? Why? How did they try to do the same thing to Jesus in the temple?
- Given John and Jesus' encounters, how do you think this relates to today? How does this help you?

#### **FRIDAY** // Read John 1:24-27, Matthew 12:1-8

- What do you see about how the religious leaders approached John and how it continued with Jesus? (i.e., grain)
- What does this highlight about the dangers of bunny trails and the risk to the Gospel? Be specific.
- Give an example of how this can happen today when talking to non-Christians. How can this be protected?

# **SATURDAY** // Read John 1:26-28, Matthew 3:11, Luke 3:15-16

- Culturally, what did "not worthy to untie" mean? How was John avoiding the leaders question? Why?
- Why did John quickly divert to the authority of Jesus? In what way did he protect his message? (The Gospel)
- How does this help you when talking about Jesus and the Gospel to others? Be specific.

**MEDITATION VERSE**: <sup>22</sup>So they said to him, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" <sup>23</sup>He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said."
