Point #1

- a) Read John 1:35-41. What is similar about John the Baptist, Andrew, and Phillip's approach to sharing Jesus?
- b) How does this relate to Point #1? How can fulfilling the Great Commission get overcomplicated? What is the result?
- c) In what way does this adjust your perspective regarding evangelism? How will you step into Point #1 this week?

Point #2

- a) Read John 1:42-51. How much did John the Baptist participate in Andrew's discussion with Jesus?
- b) How about Phillip and Nathanial with Jesus? How does this highlight the truth of Point #2?
- c) Why is this important to understand when helping non-Christians see Jesus? How does Point #2 encourage you?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read John 1:35-39, Psalm 66:5

- What was John highlighting when telling his disciples that Jesus was the "lamb of God"?
- What happened after that? What does this highlight about your role in fulfilling the Great Commission?
- How does this help you with the topic of evangelism? How will you step into this truth this week?

TUESDAY // Read John 1:42-44, Matthew 4:18-23

- How do you see yesterday's daily devotion (come and see) at work with both Andrew and Phillip?
- In what way is Matthew 4:18-23 a different calling? Be specific. What does this imply about discipleship?
- Why is this important to recognize in terms of the Gospel? How does this encourage you?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 1:39, 46-49

- How much did John participate in Andrew's discussion with Jesus? How about Phillip and Nathanial?
- What does it highlight about spreading the Gospel and fulfilling the Great Commission? Be specific.
- Why is this important to remember when pointing non-Christians to Jesus? How does this adjust your approach?

THURSDAY // Read John 1:47-51, Genesis 27:1-38, 28:10-13

- What was Jesus highlighting about Nathanial by calling him a "true Israelite in whom there is no deceit"?
- How did Nathanial's interaction with Jesus highlight this truth? Why did Nathanial ultimately believe in Jesus?
- What did Jesus highlight about himself referencing Genesis 28:10-13? What does this teach about evangelism?

FRIDAY // Read John 1:50-51, Daniel 7:13-14, Mark 13:24-27, 14:62

- Given that Jesus often referred to himself as "The Son of Man", what do you think He was implying?
- In what way was it different than the "Son of God"? Explain how Daniel 7:13-14 relates.
- Why would this have been important to the disciples? How does this demonstrate how God will reveal himself?

SATURDAY // Read John 1:35-39. Luke 6:12-16

- What is similar and different about John's list of disciples and Luke's list? Be specific.
- How do the differences relate to their purpose and application? (i.e. John's reveals evangelism)
- Given that Simon Peter had two names, how does this help explain Nathanial and Bartholomew?

MEDITATION VERSE: ³⁵The next day again John was standing with two of his disciples, ³⁶and he looked at Jesus as he walked by and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God!" ³⁷The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus.
