Point #1

- a) Read John 6:14-15. Why didn't Jesus allow the crowd to make Him king? How does John 18:36 support this?
- b) In what way does this relate to Point #1? What can happen if this isn't biblically understood? Give an example.
- c) How can Christians still be passionate about American politics and not violate Point #1? How does this adjust you?

Point #2

- a) Read John 6:16-27. Why did the crowd continue to follow Jesus? How were their priorities misplaced?
- b) In what way did Jesus correct them? Be specific. How does Point #2 relate? Why is this important?
- c) How can this happen with Christians in politics today? What is the solution? How does Point #2 help you?

MONDAY // Read John 6:14-15, Luke 20:22-26

- Why do you think the crowd wanted to make Jesus their king? Be specific. How was this a political issue?
- In what way did the Pharisees also try to bait Jesus into their politics? How did Jesus respond? Why?
- What does this imply about conflating Jesus and politics? How does this challenge you or adjust you? Be specific.

TUESDAY // Read John 6:14-15, 12:9-19, 18:36, Matthew 27:20-23

- In what way would the crowd and disciples have benefited if Jesus had accepted the offer to become king?
- How was this also displayed on Palm Sunday? What happened when Jesus did not step into their political roll?
- What does this reveal about political motives and Jesus? How can this happen today? How can this be avoided?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 6:14-24, Matthew 14:20-36, Mark 6:42-56

- In what way is John's account different than both the Gospel of Mark and Matthew's account? Be specific.
- What does this imply about John's purpose and message that he wants to relate to his readers?
- Given John was an eye-witness and on the boat with Jesus, what is your takeaway from his account?

THURSDAY // Read John 6:25-27, John 3:16, Matthew 5:14-16, 28:18-19

- What priority did Jesus set forth to the crowd that was following Him? Why? How does this relate to John 3:16?
- In what way does this relate to Matthew 5:14-16 and 28:19? Be specific.
- How can this same thing happen today when it comes to Jesus and politics? What is the solution? Be specific.

FRIDAY // Read John 6:25-27, Matthew 22:35-40, Romans 13:1-10

- What direction did Jesus provide to the crowd trying to fight against the oppressive Roman government?
- What message did the Apostle Paul give to Roman Christians who were also fighting against Roman oppression?
- How does this provide insight into how Christians should conduct themselves in today's political arena?

SATURDAY // Read John 6:25-27, Matthew 6:25-37, Philippians 4:6-7

- Given the misplaced motives of the crowd following Jesus, how can fear and anxiety contribute to the problem?
- How does the Apostle Paul address this issue to the Philippian church? What is the solution? Be specific.
- In what way do you struggle with fear and anxiety? How does this help you regarding the future of our country?
