

Grow Group Discussion Questions

A grow group is 8-16 people who get together weekly to study God's word and the previous Sunday's message. There is a time of discussion, support, encouragement, and learning how the message applies to daily life. *PCC uses the ESV (English Standard Version).*

Point #1

a) Read John 7:1-9. Why did the brothers encourage Jesus to attend the feast of booths? How was it smart?

- b) Why didn't Jesus accept? Given the brothers were not believers, how does Point #1 relate? Be specific.
- c) In what way can going along with the crowd prevent operating in godly wisdom? How does Point #1 help you?

Point #2

- a) Read John 7:10-24. How did Jesus expose the manipulation of scripture by the religious leaders?
- b) Explain the difference between judgement by "appearances" vs. "right judgment". What is the risk?
- c) Given that wisdom is found in God's word, how can Point #2 help? How does this adjust your current approach?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read Proverbs 2:1-7, 3:13-14, 8:11, 9:10, 17:24, James 1:5

- Given that "wisdom" is mentioned over 200 times in scripture, what does this imply for you?
- Why will wisdom always be different than simply being smart or going to college? (Hint: man vs God)
- What does scripture teach about wisdom's origin? What does this imply about your responsibility?

TUESDAY // Read John 6:12-15, 53-66, 7:1-5

- Why did Jesus' brothers recommend He attend the feast of booths? How would this have been a good strategy?
- Given the brothers of Jesus were not believers, what does this imply about their perspective? (c.f. Proverbs 9:10)
- In what way will the wisdom of God always be different than world logic? How have you experienced this?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 7:1-13, 6:15, Matthew 4:8-10

- In what way did the brothers of Jesus try to help Him? Why didn't Jesus take their suggestion?
- How did Jesus have a similar exchange with Satan after fasting for 40 days in Matthew 4:8ff? Be specific.
- What does this teach you about walking in the wisdom of God? Why is this important to always remember?

THURSDAY // Read John 7:1-19, 5:8-18

- How did Jesus expose the evil plan of the Jewish leadership? In what way were their hands tied to respond?
- How would the brothers' approach to Jesus attending the festival have prevented this from happening?
- What does this reveal about Jesus operating in godly wisdom? How does this help you today?

FRIDAY // Read John 7:19-24, Genesis 2:1-3, 17:9-14, Leviticus 12:3

- How did Jesus confront the religious leaders' approach to the sabbath? How did they miss its meaning?
- In what way was their approach "appearance" driven rather than a "right" judgment? Be specific.
- How does this relate to a lack of wisdom? What does this teach about seeking the deeper meaning of scripture?

SATURDAY // Read John 7:19-24, Matthew 5:21-22, 27-28, 33-35, 38-39, 43-44

- How did Jesus confront the superficial application of God's word by the religious leaders in the temple?
- How did He do the same thing in the Sermon on the Mount? What should this teach Christians today?
- What is at risk if this isn't properly understood? How does this challenge or adjust you? Be specific.

MEDITATION VERSE: ⁶For the LORD gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding; ⁷he stores up sound wisdom for the upright; he is a shield to those who walk in integrity... **Proverbs 2:6-7**
